

Restaurants, Bars & Waterways...

All Need To Be Clean!

The storm drain system takes stormwater (and pollution!) straight to our waterways.

Improper restaurant/bar practices can pollute our waterways and result in costly fines up to \$10,000!

Pour It Inside!

Don't wash anything outside unless the washwater is captured and discharged to the sanitary sewer system. Pour mop washwater down an appropriate indoor drain; screen out solids first. Make sure building floor drains are not connected to the stormwater drainage system.



Clean It Up!

Never let litter, cigarette butts, or spills go down storm drains. Clean up outdoor spills immediately using dry cleanup methods like absorbing with rags. Routinely collect litter off of sidewalks.



Watch That Grease!

Keep outdoor grease bins secure and make sure grease doesn't get onto pavement. Maintain kitchen grease traps and have them pumped out regularly.



Dumpster Discipline!

Keep lids closed and plugs in place. Areas around dumpsters should be kept clean. Do not put liquids in dumpsters or hose them out. Inspect dumpsters regularly and have any problems fixed.



Chemical Danger!

Store chemicals and hazardous materials so they're not exposed to rain or where they could leak, spill, or be vandalized. Dispose of chemicals in accordance with the law. Do not apply chemicals to sidewalks or pavement.



Only Rain Down the Storm Drain!

Help prevent pollution. Avoid fines.
